Week 3 Isaiah 24-27
Judgment and Triumph

“For when your judgments are in the earth, the inhabitants of the world learn righteousness.”

Isaiah 26:9

Main Point: God’s deliverance is not only for His own people, but for all nations who turn to Him.

Why would God do this?

God does all things to glorify His name.

The coming judgment...

- Will be in every corner of every land (24:1, 4)
- Will be on all classes of people (24:2)
- Will remove joy and pleasure (24:7-13)

Point: God does not take pleasure in the destruction of the wicked or in the punishment of His own children.

“The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness, keeping steadfast love for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, but who will by no means clear the guilty...”

Exodus 34:6-7

Point: No high mountain, no fortified defense will prevent the Lord's judgment.

There is nowhere we can go
that God does not see our sin.

*"Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I
flee from your presence? If I go up to the
heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the
depths, you are there."*

Psalm 139:7-8 (NIV)

Point: Without repentance, grace is
unproductive.

If we do not experience the costs of our sinful
behavior, we will see no reason to change.

God will bring peace- spiritual peace.
Apart from His grace, goodness and
faithfulness the people of God would
have no hope, no future.

*"And in that day a great trumpet will be blown, and
those who were driven out to the land of Egypt will
come and worship the Lord on the holy mountain at
Jerusalem."*
